We raised a great amount of money at our safety auction in the spring and we filled the River Safety Training class in April. Most rivers take applications from December 1 to January 31, so you have time right now, but it'll disappear faster than you think it will.

I've said this many times that it's finally becoming common knowledge. OWA now has two extensive Wilderness First Aid kits and AED's that go on all club trips and are available for club members to take on private trips as well. I encourage you all to take both an AED and First Aid Kit with you on your next private trip. You can check them out by sending an email to firstaid@oregonwhitewater.org. The original First Aid Kit and AED spent so much time out on rivers and that's why the Board voted to purchase a second set and I think that's great!

I want to give a big thanks to Next Adventure, Cascade River Gear, eNRG Kayaking, Immersion Research, NRS, Alder Creek, and Goodwater Boat Works for donating to the raffle. Oros, a new athletic wear start up, gave every woman who participated a sweatshirt featuring their base layer innovation. If you haven't heard of them, you should check it out. They worked with NASA to create a textile that mimics the materials used to insulate the space stations and is super lightweight making it the perfect under layer for a dry suit.

We had 46 women attend the event on the White Salmon river on October 19th. The day before the event we got a good rain which meant that the flows were in a more ideal and forgiving range. The weather started out a little grey in the morning but it turned into a beautiful day on the water. We broke the day into two halves to accommodate all level of paddlers.

From 10 am to 12:30 women ran the middle section of the White Salmon. The women in this group broke up into 4"pods" - 3 pods of 5-6 kayakers and the forth pod was a group of women in a raft which held the sweep position. We met up with the more novice and intermediate paddlers around 1:00 and cheered on all the advanced paddlers that chose to run Husum falls. For the lower section of the White Salmon River, instead of pods, the more experienced boaters individually partnered up with less experienced boaters to mentor and challenge them with skill building exercises down the river.

No one kept track of the number of flips or rolls or swims, though the swims were few. We focused on having fun and enjoying the float and learning from other women. There was an amazing moment when the wind blew just right and released all the golden and amber leaves from the trees which rained down over the river like magic. After the paddle, we ended the day eating pizza, catching up with old friends, making new friends, and celebrating what is believed to be the 20th annual Girl Paddle in good style. The holidays are upon us once again which means it is time for our annual party. It will be held at the Lucky Labrador Beer Hall on NW Quimby street. How to play the game:

- 1. Everyone brings an inexpensive gift to the party. Bring a river or camping related item or something hilarious that someone "other than you" MUST HAVE. Preferably it is something you already own laying around the house or garage.
- 2. All gifts should be wrapped with no outside markings. You shouldn't know who the gifts are from or what they are.
- 3. Everyone puts their gift in a pile on the table and will draw a number.
- 4. Number 1 goes first, picks and unwraps a gift.
- 5. Number 2 can pick a gift off the table or "steal" an unwrapped gift from another person. If an unwrapped gift is "stolen" the person it is stolen from can then steal or pick a wrapped gift.
- 6. A gift cannot be "stolen" more than twice. So whoever steals it second gets the gift.

Recipe of the Month



INGREDIENTS

Dough:

2.5 cups flour

1 tsp kosher salt

1 Tbl sugar

1 cup cold butter

2 tsp apple cider vinegar

1/2 cup ice water or more if needed

Filling:

2 Tbl butter

2 celery stalks, diced

1 yellow onion, diced

2 carrots, diced

3 cloves garlic, minced

2 russet potato cubed, boiled, drained

1 lb chicken thighs, diced

2 Tbl parsley

1Tbl thyme

1Tbl sage

1/2 Cup flour

1 cup heavy cream

1 cup frozen or canned peas.

DIRECTIONS.

For Dough: Whisk together dry ingredients in a bowl. Cut butter into one inch cubes and add to dry ingredients. Mash butter with a fork or hands into dry ingredients until butter is about "pea" sized pieces. Add vinegar. Add 1/2 c cold water and bring mixture together to for a dough. Press dough into a "pancake" shape, then wrap with plastic and put into refrigerator for at least an hour.

For Filling: Melt butter in dutch oven. Sauté celery, onion, carrots, garlic, herbs, salt and pepper until vegetables are soft. Add chicken and continue cooking until chicken is cooked. Sprinkle flour over mixture and mix in quickly. Cook while stirring about 3 minutes until flour gets absorbed. Slowly stir in cream. Place dutch oven over coals and let cook without lid. Roll out dough to the size of dutch oven. Gently place dough on top of chicken mixture. Immediately cover and add coals to the top of dutch oven. Temp should be 375-400 and about 1 hour to cook. Dough should be golden brown when ready.

Note there are online guides that show the number of coals that should be used to get the oven to a certain temperature. This will vary depending on whether you are using a cast iron or aluminum dutch oven, the air temperature, the wind, and elevation.

<u> Knot of the Month - Double Fisherman's</u>

Each month we will showcase essential knots vou should know for river situations


Overview

- •Used to form high-strength loops from cords.
- •Tied correctly you will see a double XX on one side and a smooth barrel on the other.

Hints

- •Tie the first half on your left side, then flip the knot over and tie the second half exactly the same way. This way you can easily tie the know correctly.
- Always complete the wraps in the same direction.
- •The tails will come out on opposite sides.
